



SECURA All-College Scholarship

Background:

SECURA All-College Scholarships are awarded exclusively to eligible dependents of SECURA's non-officer associates who have been employed for at least one year. The program began with scholarships awarded in 1989 and has continued to award scholarships each year thereafter.

Eligibility: (taken into consideration to determine recipients)

- Dependent children of SECURA's non-executive associates:
 - Graduating high school seniors
 - High school juniors applying to college on Early Admission status
- Planning to pursue an associate's or undergraduate degree from an accredited college or university as a full-time student
- Minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA
- Participation in extracurricular activities, including volunteering, **and/or** part-time employment outside of school
- Preference may be given to students planning to pursue a business-related degree

Award Amount:

Up to three \$2,000 per year renewable scholarship awards (up to four years: total \$8,000) for tuition, payable in the fall semester. If a student completes an associate degree and immediately transfers (no break in service) to a four-year college for a bachelor's degree, the student may continue to receive the scholarship funds.

Selection:

Recipients are recommended each spring by the Community Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee.

Collecting the Award & Payment Procedure:

Recipients must fill out and submit Scholarship Acceptance Form and Scholarship Verification Form through the [Scholarship Portal](https://www.grantinterface.com/Home/Logon?urlkey=cffvrscholar) (<https://www.grantinterface.com/Home/Logon?urlkey=cffvrscholar>). Recipients are required to provide supporting documents *as instructed* in the Scholarship Verification Form, such as class registration/list **with** credits listed, proof of major, grade transcript, etc.

After approval of online Scholarship Verification Form, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending. The **Community Foundation communicates with students via email**; it is the student's responsibility to keep their Scholarship Portal account updated with their current email address.

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to maintain full-time student status at an accredited college or university, pursuing an associate's or undergraduate degree, as a student in good standing.
